Keynote Speaker



Enoch Kelly Haney

An internationally recognized artist who exhibits throughout the US, England, Austria, and Asia. His art has received many awards and recognition. He has received the title Master Artists of the Five Civilized Tribes. In addition to decades of success as a painter, Kelly became the highly esteemed creator of the 22-foot, bronze sculpture entitled *Guardian* that was chosen to top the Oklahoma State Capitol Dome.

In addition to a remarkable career as an artist, Haney has also been a successful politician. He was the first full blood American Indian to serve in the Oklahoma Legislature. He was a State Senator, State Representative, Chairman of the Appropriations Committee and chief architect of legislation designed to develop and implement education programs for at-risk students (Alternative Education). Haney was also one of twenty chosen to serve on the Executive Committee of the Nation Conference of State Legislators.
